Virginia liquor laws are governed by the State Alcohol Beverage Control Board. All liquor poured on the premises must be purchased by the Hellenic Center. No liquor may be brought onto these premises for consumption for any purpose.

The Hellenic Center reserves the right to verify that guests consuming alcohol are at least 21 years old. A valid government photo I.D. is required to prove age. Unfortunately, university/college IDs cannot be accepted.

Any violation of the ABC rules and regulations may result in the termination of liquor (alcohol) service.
